Autoethnography Essay

Autoethnography is a form of qualitative research in which an author uses self-reflection and writing to explore their personal experience and connect this autobiographical story to wider cultural, political, and social meanings and understandings.

In the form of an autoethnography, you will be analyzing your own schooling experience (K-12 and University-level). In an essay of 800-1000 words, students will analyze their educational upbringing, using concepts learned in the course. Students will examine how issues of race, gender, sexual orientation, class, immigration status, and other forms of identity affected their K-12 and university experience. Students should use at least 1 reference to class reading and 1 other scholarly source to build points of comparison and contrast in analyzing educational opportunity in their communities and personal experience. (Scholarly means an analytical essay or chapter from a peer-reviewed journal or from book source minimum).
